# MEMBERSHIP IDENTIFICATION

Beginning in 2014, all members will be required to wear their membership card, in a manner that allows for visual recognition and identification as an ARGC member, when visiting club grounds. # **DUES STRUCTURE - DISCUSSION**

In an effort to increase membership retention and promote membership growth, Paul Callender presented the following ideas to think about and discuss at our next membership meeting:

Dues Restructure -

- Today a new member pays between \$218 and \$314, depending on membership class, for 1st year dues and land assessment. It is proposed that we change to initiation fee plus land assessment for year one. This is currently \$104 including tax. New member would choose membership class for second year and pay the rate in effect.
- Working members that do not complete their work time are billed the difference between the working member dues and the Social member dues plus they have to continue the next year of renewal membership as a Social member. It is Proposed that we change By-laws to permit renewal as a working member if member pays the dues difference for the previous year.

#### **FRONT GATE KEY**

#### POLITICAL INFO - HB 234

The following is additional detail for House Bill 234 as discussed by Paul Callender at the November Meeting:

"COLUMBUS -- Hunters would be allowed to use silencers on their firearms when stalking deer, wild turkey and other game, under legislation being considered in the Ohio House.

Backers say HB 234 would help prevent hearing loss and ease worries about gunfire during early morning and late evening hours.

"Suppressors or silencers can help reduce the noise of gunfire to safe hearing levels," Rep. Cheryl Grossman (R-Grove City), primary co-sponsor of the legislation, told members of the House agriculture committee Tuesday morning. "... Suppressors are a valuable asset in preventing noise-induced hearing loss. It is not unique to hear of hunters who require the use of hearing aids as a result of exposure to shooting." Under the legislation, hunters who have valid licenses,

who have paid the applicable taxes and who have completed background checks, could use silencers to hunt game birds and wild quadrupeds, including rabbits, squirrels, deer, boar and black bears.

Citing one study, Becker said there is little evidence silencers lead to increased crime. And he said more than two dozen other states already allow their use.

"Using a suppressor can make shooting firearms safer, more neighbor friendly and more enjoyable," Becker said."
