VINTAGE MILITARY RIFLE SHOOT

The 2016 Vintage Military Rifle Shoot will be held on the second *Saturday* of each month at 9:30AM beginning in April and running through November. Registration begins at 9:30AM followed by sighting in if needed. Shooting starts at 10:00AM. Cost is \$5:00 per person.

Items you supply include a safe working rifle - Bolt Action or semi Auto 1956 - NO M14/M1A1, AR15/M16 - No Optics - as issued fixed iron sights or peep, 40 rounds of surplus commercial or hand loaded ammo for course of fire, eye and ear protection, and spotting scopes are optional.

Open bolt indicators must be used; will be provided first time only. Will shoot from 50 yards and 100 yards. Optional money shoots at end of course - mystery target and yardage - winner takes pot.

MANDATORY NRA MEMBERSHIP

Greg Keefer presented the following proposal to the Board:

"Neighboring clubs require a mandatory NRA membership as a condition of belonging. They do this for a reason. The NRA aggressively defends your rights to own and use your firearms. The NRA champions American's individual rights and strives to block efforts by misguided government officials, legislators and courts attempting to strip away these guarantees. They are aggressive fundraisers but they are the gun owner's greatest alley in our fight against restrictions and confiscations pushed by Obama, Clinton, and Bloomberg to name a few.

The NRA also offers many member benefits and a choice of outstanding monthly magazines. If additional donations are not appropriate for you, just hang up the phone and toss the NRA mailings. You can then still feel good about supporting the NRA and its efforts by being a member.

Many are frustrated by another 'required' or 'mandatory' by-law to deal with. The State requires vehicle insurance. If not you would probably insure your vehicle anyway as you would be foolish not to. A NRA membership is insurance for your gun rights. It only makes sense.

New NRA memberships generate \$10.00 each for our club and renewals \$5.00. The NRA also offers grants for various projects and a 100% NRA club will receive a higher priority. Our club is always searching for additional income. If you do the math this is a substantial amount.

In summary, being a member of the NRA is the right thing to do for yourself, your children and your club's current and future gun rights."

BY-LAW PROPOSAL

Article VI: Qualification of Members

(NRA membership is mandatory. A current NRA membership card will be required when paying annual dues. A copy of member's current NRA card is required with mail-in payments. A NRA membership application will be supplies in the new member orientation packet.) A second reading will be held at the January meeting with a membership vote in February.
