New Cartridge: 350 Legend

This article will not go into detail on all the history or development of this cartridge. Instead, it will focus on whether it is for you.

The 350 Legend cartridge came out in early 2019 as a straight-wall rimless cartridge suitable for semiauto firearms. In fact, any AR can be easily adapted to this cartridge with a barrel change and magazine. It uses the same bolt carrier group as the standard 5.56/.223. However, we recommend that you use a "full mass" (i.e. auto – not semi auto) bolt carrier. It seems that this little bit of extra weight assists in better feeding of the semi auto. Most of the feeding malfunctions we have encountered have been resolved with this one change.

So, is it for you?

One simple question gets you started in this solution. Do you deer hunt during gun season in Ohio? Honestly, for most people, this is the only reason to consider it. There are so many cartridges that are better than the 350 Legend for almost any purpose in the AR platform – but Ohio hunting regulations prohibit us from using those other cartridges during deer gun season.

So, if the answer is "no, I don't gun hunt for deer in Ohio", then you probably aren't interested in this cartridge!

Our Ashtabula County game warden has received official notice from ODNR that this is an acceptable cartridge for Ohio deer hunting.

For deer gun season in Ohio, this cartridge in the AR platform is probably your best bet for 125 yards and under. This past deer season, we measured off two shots my brother-in-law had successfully made. Each was just over 150 yards and neither deer went further than 50 yards after a single shot. Some promotional literature would push that limit out to 200 yards – that would be a personal choice for you once you study the ballistics and your own comfort level.

The consensus seems to be that the most ethical shots for deer should be at least 1,000 foot-pounds of energy. Most of the 350 Legend ammo available today should be capable of that out to 125 to 150 yards. Even at 200 yards most 350 Legend loads are at about 900 foot-pounds. By way of comparison, a standard 55 grain 5.56 would be about 800 foot-pounds at 100 yards and drop off to 600 foot-pounds by the time it gets to 200 yards.

As far as trajectory, if you zero at 50 yards, you'll also be zeroed at 100 yards; about 2" low at 125 yards and 5" low at 150 yards. So, for hunting purposes, you should be able to work out your own zero to be point and shoot out to 125 or 150 yards.

Thankfully, this cartridge will still be quite useful year 'round. As stated earlier, if you're not gun-season deer hunter, there are better AR choices. But, if you need to use it for deer, it is a fine cartridge for most other purposes in Ohio. There's no reason it could not be used for coyote or other predators on down to varmints. It is fun with mild recoil for the range. We built one for a very small-framed 12-year old and he handled it easily. And, it is a powerful cartridge for home/self-defense.

On the other hand, if you just want it for deer season, you can get a pretty decent and affordable AR upper-only with the receiver, barrel, plastic handguards for under \$300. Add your optics, bolt carrier group, charging handle, and a \$20 magazine and use it on your existing lower. If you have parts and pieces and do it all yourself, you could get by for less.

I personally use this cartridge in an AR Pistol platform with a 12.5" barrel and suppressor. It is light and accurate with great ballistics.

This is an easy to handload cartridge. I recommend Starline brass only – the Winchester brass starts off too short and stretches enough to get case separations after just one or two loads. There are Winchester and Hornady 350 Legend bullets available and you can easily adapt others. Lee and Hornady both have die sets available. H110 is a perfect powder and Hodgdon load data is available for the Hornady 170 grain and the Winchester 180 grain bullets. I have also used .358 bullets and sized them through a .356 Lee sizer die and they work great as well. The 140 FTX 38 caliber is one example as well as the 200 FTX.

The other AR option for Ohio deer is the 450 Bushmaster. This is a very powerful, brutal cartridge and I find it no fun to shoot! But, if you're looking to stretch out 200 yards and beyond, you'd need to consider this cartridge. Two seasons ago, I took a 75-yard shot with the 450 Bushmaster and it went clear through two doe and never recovered the bullet. Then I realized this was way more than I needed for what I was doing! Plus, a few rounds at the range to sight in and I'm done. With the 350 Legend, 20-50 rounds at the range is fun day!


